A government affidavit in 2006 stated that the leak caused 558,125 injuries, including 38,478 temporary partial injuries and approximately 3,900 severely and permanently disabling injuries. My hands trembled. My skin tore. Just when Gujarat had woken up to celebrate the Republic Day on January 26th, the state shook because of a 7.7 magnitude earthquake in



2001. Killing around 20,000 people and injuring another 167,000 while destroying nearly 400,000 homes. My heart failed, my legs quaked. The Uttarakhand floods in 2013 caused anguish to the natives. The loss of life and property was heart-wrenching. Spades stabbed my back, I couldn't stand.

But I rose. I recovered. My people are happy. My culture is intact. I am still here and every day that something hits me, I hit back. My scars are a reminder of what I have endured, and what I should never let happen to me again. Today, there's so much happening. But I promise to prosper at the end of it all. I promise to rise.

Demonetisation has shaken me, but still I'll rise. The stampede at Varanasi had hurt me, but still I'll rise. The smog in Delhi choked me, but still, I rise. I promise to you, with the purest and most genuine heart, still I will rise...

Feminism: A serious social movement, not a fad

In recent years, there is more awareness and discussion on gender issues worl wide. This phenomenon hasn't escaped India either. The question of gender inequality came forefront after the 2012 Delhi gangrape protests. There was anger and a want for change. It spilled out on the streets, in the Parliament, on social media and on our TV screens. More people learned about the F-word, more started talking about it.

Many women (and men) are embracing this label than they did before. We have celebrities talking about women's issues. A shift has been observed in media too. Magazines, newspapers, advertisements and TV reportage are becoming gender sensitive. Pop culture mediums like TV shows and movies have a feminist tinge to them. Amusingly, this has given rise to a fringe counter-movement known as Men's Rights activism. They tend to exaggerate about laws being in favour of women and the oppression inflicted on men by women. One look at their arguments, it becomes clear they're propagandistic and deal in hyperboles.

While watching a movie at a cinema hall recently, I saw an advertisement. It started with a chauvinist man commenting on a woman's short skirt, "Women wear such clothes and then blame men for being provoked". Another man spills ketchup on this sexist man (who's wearing a white shirt) and says "Don't wear white shirts, they're provocative". You'd



think this is an ad in public interest but no, it's a ketchup ad, hilariously.

Commercialization of feminism borders on silly and is sometimes quite cringe- worthy. One feels a lack of sincerity in the way which the advertisement industry is in some ways exploiting women's issues. It feels like the media is using feminism as a money-minting ploy because it is the flavour of the season. There are click-bait articles by fluff media outlets which feature articles on women who do 'feminist activism' through Instagram or female celebrities mouthing some platitudes about gender equality or plus-sized women being featured at fashion shows.

Do not get me wrong, I'm not trivializing the issues of body-shaming or the sexist treatment of Bollywood actresses. Such a focus on women's issues helps in spreading awareness and changing mind- sets. But I do lament the restricted issues they portray, which does not mirror the reality of most Indian women. This kind of bourgeois feminism displayed by certain media outlets

only aims to appeal to upper middleclass, westernized, privileged women. The problem with treating feminism like a fad and a profitmaking device is that it ends up belittling it.

There needs to be more reportage on the systemic failure of the law in ensuring justice to women, more awareness on how women from the lower strata of society are affected by gender discrimination. Media should strive for more reforms in law and need to critique the working of police, judiciary and government in dealing with women's related issues. When a website reports on how a woman braved the sneering of her neighbours while having a live-in relationship, there are also women who can never dream of living

independently like this because they are so shackled by their family and would suffer grave consequences if they did so.

I have no problem with media outlets denouncing fashion magazines for airbrushing the bodies of models, as long as it followed by the highlighting of extremely poor maternal health in India and the need for criminalization of marital rape. There needs to be more substance in our gender discussion, more diversity in the issues we portray and an India-centric focus which doesn't copy the narrative of feminism in developed countries.




The Life Of A Suitcase Kid

Past her exit, the gates were shut. Ecstatically, had she embarked on her voyage.



Meet the ubiquitous crow, the early riser who silently waits for the first morsel of a chicken wing cast away from a late night dinner, an injured rat silently waiting to meet its maker; the epitome of the working class that rises to the first horn of a Mumbai local, the BMC worker, the hospital staff, the weary school teacher, the idliwala Anna, the fisherwomen -all

enriching the lives of countless Mumbaikars. I have recently been informed that the crow has gone missing from some cities of Modified Gujarat and this happened much before demonetization! But unlike the scavenger that he is, have you ever seen a crow groom his partner after the first rains? He would put to shame the best of Bollywood romances between Shahrukh and Kajol!

The common housesparrow has met a similar fate in Mumbai. Once a common visitor to housewives who cleaned their rice bought from the ration shops, this avian population has been driven away today by cleaned and packaged rice in plastic bags. They, like their sturdy counterparts of the housewives have been trying to reclaim their space in the city.

सावरकरांचे मूळ घराणे कोकणचे, परशुराम भूमीतील गुहागर येथील छत्रपती शिवराय व बाजीरावांच्या काळात त्यातील काही घराणी देशावर आली त्यातीलच सावरकर कुटुंब नाशिक जवळील भगूर येथे स्थिर झाले. येथेच २८ मे १८८३ रोजी दामोदरपंत सावरकरांच्या पत्नी सौ. राधाबाई यांनी चौथ्या मुलाला जन्म दिला, त्यांचे तेजस्वी नेत्र, विशाल भाळ, आकर्षक मुद्रा पाहून नाव ठेवले विनायक, म्हणजे विशेष नायक! मात्र विनायकाला लहानपणात मानुसुखाला पारखे व्हावे लागले.

लहानाचे मोठे होत असताना त्यांना लेखन वक्तृत्व या गुणांचा छंद जडला. एकदा एक वक्तृत्व स्पर्धेची बातमी त्यांना उशिरा समजली तरीही त्यांनी त्या स्पर्धेत भाग घेतला पण भाषण करणाऱ्यांच्या यादीत त्याचे नाव शेवटी आले. सर्व स्पर्धकांची भाषणे ऐकताना परीक्षक कंटाळले होते पण त्यांच्या बाणेदार विचारांनी, ओघवत्या भाषेनी परीक्षकांचा त्यातच त्यांनी "स्वातंत्र्यसमर", "जोसेफॅमोझिनी "," माझी जन्मठेप "," संन्यस्त /खडग " " काळेपाणी "," गोमंतक ", " सप्तर्षी ", " जातिभेद ", " हिंदुराष्ट्र दर्शन ", " क्रांतिघोष ", इ. विविध पुस्तके लिहिली. त्यांना १९३८ मध्ये मुंबई येथील महाराष्ट्र साहित्य संमेलनाचे अध्यक्ष म्हणून निवडण्यात आले. सशस्त्र राज्यक्रातीचे भारतीय धुरंधरत्व करण्याचे महाकार्य प्रथम महाराष्ट्रात व नंतर इंग्लंड येथे त्याच्या कडेच आले. हिंदू राष्ट्राला राजकीय आणि राष्ट्रीय स्वातंत्र्य मिळवून देण्याची सुवर्णसंधी त्यांना लाभली पुढे त्यांनी अंदमानच्या जेलमध्ये तुररूगाच्या भितीवर काव्य लिहिले मग ती कविता संस्कृतप्रचुर लफेवाज मराठीत असेल किंवा जजाकतदार उर्दू गझलेच्या स्वरूपात असेल, आश्चर्य वाटतं नां ? कडवे हिंदुत्वनिष्ठ असलेल्या सावरकरांची काव्यप्रतिभा अभिव्यक्तीसाठी कधीकाळी मुस्लिमांची भाषा मानल्या जाणाऱ्या

उर्दू चाही आसरा घेवू शकते.

"गांधी युगाच्या आगमनानंतर " दे दी हमे आझादी बिना खडग बिना दाल " हे स्वर सगळीकडे दुमदुमत त्या गदारोळात न डगमगता देशाच्या स्वातंत्र्याच्या आणि त्याच्या रक्षणाचा मार्गही बंदुकीच्या नळीतून जातो. या इतिहाससिद्ध तत्वाचा प्रचार करणारा पहिला निर्भींड देश भक्त होता तो म्हणजे स्वातंत्र्यवीर सावरकर!" अखेर २६ फेब्बुवारी १९६६ रोजी ते काळाच्या पडदयाआड गेले. परंतु त्याच्या साहित्य, ग्रंथलेख, या रूपाने इतिहास कायम आहे, त्यांची स्मृती आजही अजरामर आहे.

भावताची वोकडवित अर्थव्यवस्थाः स्वप्न की वास्तिवकता

आज रात्री बारा वाजल्यानंतर पाचशे व हजारच्या नोटा म्हणजे कागदाचा निव्वळ एक कपटा असतील अशी घोषणा पंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदी यांनी ι नोव्हेंबर २०१६ रोजी केली आणि देशभर एकच चलनकल्लोळ सुरू झाला देशातील काळा पैसा नष्ट करण्यासाठी मोदींनी घेतलेला हा निर्णय ऐतिहासिकच म्हणावा लागेल विरोध आणि पाठिंबा अश्या समिश्र प्रतिक्रिया लाभलेला हा निर्णय देशात बदल घडवून आणतोय अशी चिन्हे दिसू लागली आहेत.



मोदीचे "कॅशलेस इकोनॉमीचे" स्वप्न प्रत्यक्षात तेण्यास सुरूवात झाली असली तरी, व्यापाऱ्यांची व ग्राहकांची मानसिकता बदलणे गरजेचे आहे. अजूनही बऱ्याच ठिकाणी आमच्या येथे कुठल्याही बँकेचे क्रेडिट किंवा डेबिट कार्ड स्वीकारले जात नाही अश्या पाटया लावलेल्या दिसतात माझ्या मते "कॅश डिस्काउंट" ही संकल्पना नष्ट होणे गरजेचे आहे. अनेक ठिकाणी अश्या प्रकारची व्यवस्था असल्याने ग्राहक रोख व्यवहार करणेच पसंद करतात शहरी भागात आता सर्व व्यवहार पूर्वीसारखे सुरळीत चालू झाल्याचे दिसत आहे. मात्र २००० च्या सुट्टयांच्या प्रश्नामुळे ग्राहक त्रस्त आहेत. मुंबईत आता सर्वच जण कॅशलेस व्यवहार करू पाहत आहेत. रस्त्यावर सरबत, वडापाव असे पदार्थ विकणारे क्रेडिट व डेबिट कार्ड चा वापर करू लागले आहेत. भाजीवाला, दूधवाला इतकेच काय तर धोबी सुदधा Paytm अर्थात ई-वॉलेट वापरू लागली आहेत. याउलट ग्रामीण भागात तर अजून बऱ्याच ठिकाणी कार्ड म्हणजे काय? किंवा त्याचा वापर कसा करावा? या बाबतीत अनेकजण अनभिज्ञ आहेत. त्यामुळे तेथे रोकडरहित व्यवहार फार कमी प्रमाणात होतात. सरकारने अश्या महत्त्वाच्या मुद्दयांचा विचार करावा असे वाटते.

नुकत्याच प्रसिद्ध झालेल्या अहवालानुसार, देशात ८ व १ नोव्हेंबर रोजी सुमारे २३०० कोटी नोटा चलनातून बाद झाल्या आहेत. सरकार रिझर्व्ह बँकेच्या मुद्रण कारखान्याची महिन्याला ३०० कोटी नोटा छापण्याची क्षमता आहे. यामुळे या निश्चलनीकरणाच्या प्रक्रियेत अडथळा निर्माण होत आहे. नमो सरकारचा निर्णय चांगलाच; मात्र निर्णयानंतरच्या व्यवस्थापनाची तयारी अपुरी पडत आहे मात्र ८ नोव्हेंबर नंतर खासगी ई-वालेट व्यवहारात लक्षणीय वाढ झाल्याचे दिसून येत आहे.

मासिक "मन की बात" या कार्यक्रमात मोदींनी रोकडरहित अर्थव्यवस्थेचे ध्येय गाठण्याची इच्छा व्यक्त केली आहे. परंतु मोदींचे हे कॅशलेस इकोनॉमी चे स्वप्न साकार होण्यास अजून थोडा कालावधी जाणे अपेक्षित आहे. नरेंद्र मोदींच्या निर्णयाला पाठिंबा देत आपल्या राज्याचे मुख्यमंत्री श्री. देवेंद्र फडणवीस यांनी महावॉलेट नावाची व्यवस्था सुरू करण्याचे आदेश दिले आहेत. मात्र त्याचा पुरेसा प्रसार होणे गरजेचे आहे नोटबंदीनंतर देशात निर्माण झालेल्या चलनतुटवडयावर मात करण्यासाठी येत्या आठवडयात २०.००० टन नोटेच्या कागदाच्या आयातीची मागणी नोंदवण्याची तयारी सुरू आहे, अशी बातमी प्रसारित झाल्यामुळे चलन तुटवडयाचा त्रास कमी होईल अशी शक्यता वर्तवली जात आहे खऱ्या अर्थाने डिजीटल युगात प्रवेश करण्यासाठी अजून थोडा वेळ बाकी आहे. पंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदींच्या रोकडरहित अर्थव्यवस्थेच्या निर्णयाचे अनेक जणांनी स्वागत केले असाले तरी, हे स्वप्न पूर्ण करण्यासाठी सर्वांचीच धडपड सुरू आहे. भारतीय रिझर्व्ह बँक प्रयत्नाची पराकाष्टा करत आहे पुढील पाच वर्षांत भारतीय अर्थव्यवस्था कॅशलेस इकोनॉमी चे उद्दिष्टय साध्य करेल अशी अपेक्षा करते. मात्र काळया पैशाविरोधात सरकारने उचललेले हे पाऊल खोलात जाऊ नये हीच अपेक्षा.

Speech Recognition



Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) has been increasing nowadays, due to the drastic advancements in technology. HCI researches the design and use of computer technology, focused on the interfaces between people and computers. The interaction between a human and a computer is possible with the help of common input devices like keyboard, mouse, trackball, etc. But sadly, this is the limited thought which strikes people's mind when we talk about HCI. However, the technology nowadays has become so advanced that interaction between human and computer can be as realistic as the interaction between two humans.

Communication is effective when two people talk or converse with each other. But today the situation is such that a human and computer spend more time with each other than two humans. So, the communication can be more effect if human and computer communicate verbally. However, this would be possible if the computer understands the words spoken by a human. Here, Speech Recognition comes in existence.

Speech recognitionis the interdisciplinary sub-field of computational linguistics that develops methodologies and technologies that enables the recognition and translation of spoken language into text by computers. Although the technology seems to be amazing, speech recognition depends on the voice and the pitch of the user. The system analyzes the person's specific voice and uses it to fine-tune the recognition of that person's speech, resulting in increased accuracy. These systems are called as speaker dependent. Nowadays, the advancement in technology has increased to that level, where speaker independent systems also can be developed. Google is one of the best example of this technology, where what you speak is converted into text and the resultant output is interpreted.

Most of the times, people think that voice recognition and speech recognition are one and the same. But that's not the fact, in voice recognition, the system tracks the person who is speaking rather than what he is speaking. If both the technologies walk hand in hand, then resulting system could be proved helpful in many fields.

Today it is possible that messages can be sent to people on phone call without even answering the phone call. An automated voice recording answers and instructs you to press buttons to move through option menus. Many companies have moved beyond requiring you to press buttons, though. Often you can just speak certain words (again, as instructed by a recording) to get what you need. The system that makes this possible is a type of speech recognition program -- an automated phone system. See how simple is that.

If all the working spaces have the facility of speech recognition, then common input devices like keyboards and mice won't exist. People would enjoy talking with the computers rather than typing and clicking. But, if these technologies are applied in work spaces, then that industry or company would be unstable. As everyone would be busy in speaking with computers. Can you imagine how disastrous would be that? Moreover, the communication between humans won't exist. People would prefer to talk with computers than with humans. Who knows whether in future the communication between people may decrease and human computer communication may increase.

The problem is that the term "science" applies to a remarkably broad set of human endeavors, from developing lasers, to analysing the factors that affect human decision-making. beakers. All of those images reflect some aspect of science, but none of them provides a full picture because science has so many facts. Science studies the natural world. This includes the components of the physical universe around us like atoms, plants, ecosystems, people societies and galaxies, as well as the natural forces at work on those things. In contrast, science cannot study supernatural forces and explanations. For example, the idea that a supernatural afterlife exists is not a part of science since this afterlife operates outside the rules that govern the natural world.

Science is both a body of knowledge and a process. Science may sometimes seem like a collection of isolated and static facts listed in a textbook, but that's only a small part of the story. Just as importantly, science is also a process of discovery that allows us to link isolated facts into coherent and comprehensive understandings of the natural world. Science is exciting.

Science is a way of discovering what's in the universe and how those things work today, how they worked in the past, and how they are likely to work in the future. Scientists are

motivated by the thrill of seeing or figuring out something that no one has before.

The knowledge generated by science is powerful and reliable. It can be used to develop new technologies, treat diseases, and deal with many other sorts of problems.

Science is ongoing.

Science is continually refining and expanding our knowledge of the universe, and as it does, it leads to new questions for future investigation.

Science is a global human endeavor.

Science will never be "finished."People all over the world participate in the process of science. And you can too! Science is powerful. It has generated the knowledge that allows us to call a friend halfway around the world with a cell phone, vaccinate a baby against polio, build a skyscraper, and drive a car. And science helps us answer important questions like which areas might be hit by a tsunami after an earthquake, how did the hole in the ozone layer form, how can we protect our crops from pests, and who were our evolutionary ancestors? With such breadth, the reach of science might



seem to be endless, but it is not. Science has definite limits.

Science is a global human endeavor. Science can investigate all sorts of questions:

- -When did the oldest rocks on earth form?
- -Through what chemical reactions do fungi get energy from the nutrients they absorb?
- -What causes Jupiter's red spot?
- -How does smog move through the atmosphere?

Very few questions are off-limits in science — but the sorts of answers science can provide are limited. Science can only answer in terms of natural phenomena and natural processes.

When we ask ourselves questions like, What is the meaning of life? and Does the soul exist? we generally expect answers that are outside of the natural world — and hence, outside of science.





Walking along a Guided Path under the STAR...

K.C. College entered the STAR Scheme with a funding of Rs. 36 Lakhs for the first year and a total funding of Rs 58 Lakhs for the period of three years, April 2016-March 2019. A total of five departments, Chemistry, Life Sciences, Microbiology, Statistics and Biotechnology are part of this scheme. In addition to providing scientific infrastructural facilities in terms of instrumentation, the major thrust of the DBT STAR grant is skill development of the stakeholders at the undergraduate level.

College has illustrious personalities in academia such as Dr. Suman Govil- DBT representative, Dr. Vivek Patkar, an Independent researcher and author, Dr. B.B.Sharma, Principal of V.G.Vaze College, Dr. Smita Mahale, Director, National Institute of Research in Reproductive Health(NIRRH), Dr. Sunita Shailajan, Head of Botany and Coordinator of Star Scheme at Ruia College. 




