Here and now, we decide to control what the receiver gets to keep - what carefully weaved illusion they can see; everything is an effort in recanting words of spite.


It feels even more apparent when two people decide to sever their ties with each other. The silk threads between the two turn to pixels and sudden absences.


driving further away from the city, it only reminded me: this was the kind of never ending tranquility i used to seek.

Digital Misogyny: Experience that led to change in thought process

I am writing this essay with regards to

the #MeToo movement that's been in the forefront these days. Ever since this movement has made it to everyday news, I encountered troublesome experiences. Therefore, I decided to write an article narrating the incident that took place that indeed gave me the freedom to express my thoughts on the #MeToo movement.

A movement like this was the need of the hour. The impact of this movement has spread like wildfire. The movement instilled the confidence in every woman to rise and speak for their justice which has been a great step against the exploitative practices of men. However, there are still men who disagree with the concept of #MeToo and think that it's a useless concept that is highly biased and flawed. I was of the similar view earlier, until few incidents happened and changed my perspective entirely.

I have always been told that men belong to the privileged gender category and history has been proof of it. Women entered the workspace much later than men. they were not given education rights or voting rights. Their duties were confined to the four walls of the house and people always associated women with child-rearing, housekeeping and cooking. Thanks to women's movement

and the feminism movements which gave them the rights that they deserved. Fast-track to today, women enjoy a lot more rights compared to the past as they dominated the workspace and some have been very successful in their Carriers. Eg Indra Nooyi, Indira Gandhi, Benazir Bhutto, Mamta Baerjee etc.

Even though we get to see these as examples of exceptional cases does that mean that the problem is solved? We are



living in an extremely advanced society and people becoming progressive with the shift of everyday. Does that mean gender biases are not practical anymore? Has the time changed for women where they get equal rights and previleges as men do in their personal and socioeconomic life? Until now I carried forward a typical opinion that women enjoy privileges but along with that they creates a fuss about everything. I was enable to relate to small incidents that go unnoticed when seen from eyes of a male, but in reality hold be predominant. I went through few incidents actually changed my perception towards these issues. It led me to take account of these incidents more seriously and not consider them as something casual.

Speaking of me, I am a guy with long hair and with not a very muscular body. My hair is of shoulder length, which goes against the normative appearance

of a normal guy. Also since I am not very muscular, I could be confused to be a girl from afar or just at a glance. I have had instances where people have not only mistaken me as a girl, but also addressed to me a "Ma'am". Although my reaction to all this would stick to laughing it off up until the day I came along with this encounter that was way above an informal friendly mistake. This couldn't be easily ignored.

The first incident took place when I was returning from my friend's house at Bandra. I got late and left his house at around 11pm. I went to the bus-stop to take the BEST bus to my house, at Worli, I am used to returning home late, post midnight in most cases. While I was waiting for my bus to arrive, there was this drunk beggar

who had a garbage bag with him. He was sleeping at the bus stop. He was intoxicated. There was nobody else to witness the scene, He suddenly turned towards me and said "aye chokri, kya dekh rahi hai?" (hey girl, what are you looking at?). I realised he also mistook me as a girl because I had left my hair open. Although I knew he was addressing me I did not respond, and continued waiting for the bus. I did not react at that point because it was the main road and there was enough movement and activity happening as the cars were regularly coming and going. The beggar couldn't really do anything to me because he was already drunk out of his mind. I could trick him and he wouldn't even realise. He continued to blabber things and kept addressing me as chokri (girl) and I didn't really respond until he started walking up to me. That is when I got slightly uncomfortable. I did not want to get into a confrontation with

him. He continued saving "bol na kva dekh Rahi hai?". (Tell me what are you looking at?). While walking towards me he also verbally abused me . I decided that it was the time to walk out of there quietly and ignore him. As I sprinted on the main road, he started following me until I reached the next bus stop. I was a bit relieved as the street lights on this road were working bright and the main road was more active with cars. There were few bikers with their girlfriends loitering around at the bus-stop. At this point, help was readily available. I asked one of those bikers for help. I told them about the beggar following me and they were more than ready to help. The biker guy slapped the beggar and asked him to go away. The beggar stood stunned since he was trying to register what had just happened. He yet lingered around the bus stop. By this time my bus had finally arrived and I was getting onto it. the beggar yet again ran behind and followed me trying to make his way into the bus. I entered the bus from the front and to my surprise he had climbed the bus from the behind stair. The bus started moving and I immediately told the bus driver to stop, he slowed down so that I could get off. I descended the bus quickly without him noticing me and I told the bus driver to keep driving in the usual pace. I saw the man in the bus as the bus passed by. And that was end of my traumatizing evening. I eventually took a cab to get home safely, but the entire ride back home I coudn't stop thinking about what had just happened.

The second incident is not that long. I was out early in the morning around 7 am to have breakfast at a restaurant. As I finished off with my breakfast, I was ready to go take a cab home. While I was waiting for my cab I heard someone sing something like "tere zulfe oohoo..." (your hair ohoo...). I turned behind to see who was this. It turned out to be a taxi

driver who in turn was shocked to see me as he realised that I was a guy and not a girl. He immediately stopped singing, gave me a blank look and carried on with driving the cab.

I have often discussed these incidents with my friends and we have laughed it off. I am able to laugh at these incidents because in both cases I was misunderstood to be a girl. Although it would have disgusted any girl if she was to be in my place, in a way I am grateful that I witnessed these eye opening incidents that helped me realise a whole new prespective. I now here intend to wrongly accuse any gender as a whole but the minor concept of priviledge that men tend to enjoy which is often overlooked.

Igotabetterunderstanding of the #MeToo movement when I starting studying this academically. I am a TYBA sociology student and I Understood women's rights and the women's movement in a much better manner when I came across to concept of intersectionality. The concept of intersectionality is indeed important point to consider while studying gender studies. Most people do not acknowledge this, even girls for that matter, since they are unaware. Also the depth of these studies could be known only by studying it. The concept of intersectionality states that there are invisible filters that act as oppressors for the oppressed. Patriarchy is just one layer of oppression while there can be multiple layer how an individual can be oppressed. Another recent example we can take is of Priyanka Chopra where she is mocked for marrying Nick Joans. The online comments follow with instances of mocking her for the age gap that they have or facial features of hers and regarding her race and gender.

I have come across discussion about the

movement with men not surprisingly they have a typical male bias to it. They think that it's an unnecessary movement that's been gaining light. Most of them claim that women can easily put a false allegation on men about sexual assualt that could eventually jeopardize the man's whole life. They are of opinion that women have an upper hand on this because the law can easily be misused to a woman's advantage. However, they do not realize that there has been a tremendous burden on women already. This is exactly where the #Metoo movement plays an important role-to shift the burden from women to men in the right sense. To create a healthy environment where everyday violence to women are not normalized and given a fair justice to women. Traveloque: Revisiting the Past

In the hustle and bustle life of the dream city Bombay lies a very silent spot to rest and forget one's worries. Yes, it's none other than the Sanjay Gandhi National

divided into 3 sects:-

1] Hinayana or Theravad: which believes that Buddha as a historical figure and learned teacher. Buddha is depicted as a lotus or a rider less horse or even just a tree.

Buddhism is also divided into sects. It is The most eye catchy part of any Buddhist place is the 'STUPAS'. So first thing one sees in the cave no. 2 is a stupa. Let me tell you that a 'STUPA' is a funeral mound containing the relics of a great teacher or disciple or an important person.

> The most important cave in the Kanheri complex is the Chaitya No.3. It is a prayer hall. Overall if we closely notice it has all the combinations of rituals of all three sects of Buddhism. In the entrance wall and also on the pillars we find inscriptions written in brahmi and in the Prakrit language. As we enter we find a large statue of Buddha on both sidewalls. Also there is a very small relief of Dipatara, the goddess of the western seas, pointing to the North Star. Inside the chaitya there is a large stupa in the centre and also place to do pradakshina. It is said to be the place where monks chanted prayers and attended confession ceremonies. On the pillars we find rich





Park. But have you ever visited the Kanheri caves inside the park? A place so close to city and yet so silent and peaceful!

It's just 6 km inside the park. Can you imagine that it has around 110 caves? It was occupied by mostly the Buddhist monks and nuns from around 1st century AD to 9th century AD. The name 'Kanheri' itself is derived from Sanskrit word "Krsnagiri" which means "Black Mountain", indicating its geological nature. The mountains are made of conglomerate basalt. All the caves follow the principle of rock cut architecture. The monks following the principle of the middle path were encouraged neither to isolate themselves in the forest not reside in the city and so they opted to stay close to human habitations but in the forested areas.

2] Mahayana: This tradition deified Buddha. They began to worship the idol of Buddha and the Bodhisattvas.

3] Vairayana : Tantrism had impact on every religion as also on Buddhism. They introduced the concept of 5 Dynani Buddha' and 'Tara'.



merchants on elephants, lions, bullocks as well as some unknown animal.

One of the largest cave one may come across is Cave no. 11. It has three big entrances and large windows. Inside the cave, there are two long platforms in the centre. There are small rooms inside the caves. As we have no evidence of what the cave was used for, but we can speculate that that it may have been used a library or a place for meditating. It could also have been used for copying various manuscripts.



The inscription in the cave records the donation by Gomin Avighnakara who hailed from Gauda country and made a perpetual endowment of 100 drammas for the construction of a meditation room and raiment for monks.



Cave no. 34 has a painting of 5 Dhyani Buddhas in outline and red pigment. Perhaps the incomplete pictures indicates shortage in donations or the fact that Buddhism as a religion was not popular anymore.

One of the most fascinating sculptures is the sculpture of the 11 headed Avalokiteshwara in cave no. 41. The sculpture is very beautifully made and is mesmerizing. Besides it is a large relief of Buddha and to the right of Buddha is a relief of the Bodhisattva, Avalokiteshwara Padmapani.



Did you know that one of the earliest remains of a dam is also found in Kanheri Caves with the inscription recording the name of the donor viz. "Punaka", a rich merchant from Sopara.

One of the most thrilling part of kanheri is a visit to the "Cemetery". Once a person reaches the top of the caves, they have to walk down almost 2km. It definitely tests one's trekking capabilities. Most of the steps constructed have been destroyed due to erosion. The cemetery has a number of small stupas of great teachers and disciples including those of some famous women teachers!

A beautiful story is recounted in the relief of Sumedha just before entering cave no 67. The story tells that one of the former Buddha wanted to cross a small water body but didn't want his



feet to get wet. So, Sumedha who is supposed to have very long hair laid his hair on the path of and Buddha walked on it. He was blessed to be born as the Shakyamuni Buddha in his next life!

So it seems that a single day is rather short to see each and every cave slowly and calmly. But being in the monastery makes on want to absorb the positive energy from the calm and ancient caves inside the womb of rich environment. Its meditative charm, silent nature and peaceful environment transports one back to an ancient past!

मुंबई लोकल ट्रेन में सफर करना एक जंग जीतने से कम नहीं है। कहा जाता है मुंबई एक ऐसा शहर हैं जो कभी नहीं सोता, लेकिन मुंबई के रहने वाले लोग लोकल ट्रेन में खड़े खड़े भी सो लेने में माहिर हैं। चर्चगेट, सीएसटी, दादर, विरार इत्यादि स्टेशन पर ट्रेन आने के पहले स्टेशन पर खड़ी भीड़ का नजारा देख के अच्छे अच्छों के पसीने छूट जाते हैं और ट्रेन रुकने के पहले ही अधिक से अधिक लोग ट्रेन मैं बैठ चुके होते हैं। बाद में ट्रेन रुकने के बाद जो आया वह बस या तो खड़ा रहेगा या फिर चौथी सीट (आधी सीट) के लिए मिन्नतें करता या झगड़े करता मिलेगा। हाँ प्रथम श्रेणी के डिब्बों में चौथी सीट (आधी सीट) पर बैठने का दस्तूर नहीं। वैसे भी प्रथम श्रेणी के मुसाफिरों में मदद करने की आदत कम ही देखी जाती है। विंडो सीट जिसे मिल गयी वह समझता है उसने जंग जीत लिया और इस जीत की खुशी उसके चेहरे और शरीर की अकड़ में साफ देखी जा सकती है। इस ट्रेन में बहुत किस्म के इंसान मिलते हैं, बस आप 3-4 बार विंडो सीट पे बैठने का तजुर्बा कर लें, मेरी बात स्वयं समझ जाएँगे। कोई इंसान आप को सिमट के बैठने की जगह दे देगा, कोई और फैल जाएगा ऐसे कि आप ठीक से बैठ भी ना सकें और अक्सर मैंने कुछ लोगों को चौथी सीट में बैठ के उठते हुए भी देखा है। आप भी सोच रहे होंगे यह चौथी सीट है क्या। भाई यह हिन्दुस्तान के नागरिकों के भाईचारे की, इंसानियत की पहचान है, जो प्रथम श्रेणी के कोच में सफर करनेवालों में खत्म होती जा रही है। तीन सीट तक बैठने की जगह एक बर्थ में हुआ करती है। यदि तीनों लोग जरा जरा सा सिमट के बैठ जाएँ तो चौथी सीट या आधी सीट और बैठने के लिए निकल आया करती है, है ना इंसानियत और भाईचारे की मिसाल? मैं द्वितीय श्रेणी का इन्सान हूँ इसी श्रेणी में सफर करता था, चौथी सीट ही मिला करती थी अक्सर, चलती ट्रेन में ना चढ़ पाने के कारण. एक दिन मुझे मेरे एक मित्र अपनी पहली प्रथम श्रेणी के डिब्बें की यात्रा के बारे में बताने लगे... यार मैं पहली बार जब प्रथम श्रेणी के डिब्बें चढ़ा तो आदतनुसार, चौथी सीट पे बैठने की कोशिश की. तीसरी सीट वाले बोले ..ऐ भैया मुंबई में नया आया है क्या.. में घबरा गया अपने यूपी में जिसको भैया कहा जाता है उससे इज्जत से बात करते हैं, यह कौन है जो भैया बोल के डाँट रहा है। मैंने इज्जत से कह दिया हाँ भाई, अभी दो साल ही हुए हैं। वह महाशय नरमी से जवाब देने के कारण, चुप हो गए और 10 मिनट बाद खुद खड़े होकर मुझे बैठने को जगह भी दे दी। उन्होंने तब बताया, मुंबई लोकल ट्रेन में प्रथम श्रेणी में चौथी सीट पे नहीं बैठा जाता। उसी दिन मुझे पता चला कि जैसे-जैसे इंसान के पास पैसा आता जाता है, वह वैसे-वैसे खुद के आराम के बारे में अधिक और दूसरों की तकलीफ के बारे में कम सोचने लगता है। उनकी इस बात ने मुझे एक सीख जरूर दे दी कि

मैं भी जब प्रथम श्रेणी के डिब्बें में बैठूं तो चौथी सीट पाने की कोशीश न करूँ। वैसे यहाँ बताता चलूँ की भैया मुंबई में यूपी, बिहार वालों को पुकारते हैं. भैया मतलब दूधवाला-सब्जीवाला। वहीं आगे जा के लोकल के में डिब्बों धीरे-धीरे भीड़ बढ़ती जाती है और 3-4 स्टेशन बाद तो यह भी पता नहीं लगता की आपकी शर्ट बाहर है या अंदर, यह भी पता नहीं लगता की कौन किसको कहाएँ धक्के मार रहा है, लोग धक्का लगने पे कुछ बोलते नहीं बस हिल के रह जाते हैं, आदत सी पड़ चुकी होती है।

मुंबई लोकल ट्रेन में झगड़े भी एक आम सी बात है, कभी कोई घर में लड़ के आया होता है तो ट्रेन में गुस्सा निकालता है और कभी कोई बॉस की डाँट खा के आया होता है तो ट्रेन में सभी को डाँट के बॉस बनने का नाटक करता है। अधिकतर झगड़े, या तो चौथी सीट के लिए, या खड़े होने पे धक्के लगने के कारण या गेट पे चढऩे की जगह घेर के खड़े लोगों के कारण हुआ करते हैं.. इतनी बड़ी भीड़ में और वह भी 98 प्रतिशत रोजी रोटी के लिए जाने वाले मुसाफिरों में चिड़चिड़ापन एक आम सी बात है, इसलिए ऐसे बेबुनियाद झगड़ों में बर्दाश्त करते बात ना बढऩे दी जाए वही बेहतर होता है। अंत में यही कहना चाहूँगा कि आपने अगर मुंबई की लोकल में यात्रा की है और यदि चौथी सीट का आनंद नहीं लिया तो आपकी लोकल यात्रा अधूरी है। अत: अपनी जिंदगी में लोकल की चौथी सीट का आनंद अवश्य लें।

मित्रमेंत्रिणींनो, मी आज तुम्हांला दिसतो ना, तसा जन्माच्या वेळी नव्हतो. जन्मापासून माझ्यात खूप बदल होत गेले आहेत. मला अनेक रूपे मिळत गेली. माझा जन्म झाला २२ ऑगस्ट १९०७ रोजी जर्मनीमध्ये. त्या दिवशी मादाम कामा या राष्ट्रभक्त महिलेने समाजवाद्यांच्या जागतिक परिषदेमध्ये भारताचा राष्ट्रध्वज म्हणून तिरंगी निशाणाची निर्मिती केली. ते माझे पहिले रूप! या निशाणात हिरवा, केशरी व तांबडा या रंगाचे तीन आडवे पट्टे होते. हिरव्या पट्टयात कामळाची आठ चित्रे, केशरी पट्टयात 'वंदे मातरम्' ही अक्षरे आणि तांबडया पट्टयात सूर्यचंद्राची चित्रे असा माझा एकंदरित साज होता.पण मित्रांनो, या रुपामध्ये मी भारतात मात्र वावरू शकलो नाही.

काही वर्षांनंतर म्हणजे १९१६ साली ॲनी बेझंट आणि लोकमान्य टिळक यांनी अटकेत असताना मला दुसरे रूप दिले. पाच तांबडे पट्टे व चार हिरवे पट्टे असलेल्या वरच्या डाव्या कोपऱ्यात युनियन जॅक, त्याखाली सात तारे व उजवीकडे चांद अशी चिन्हे धारण करणारा राष्ट्रध्वज, असे माझे रूप सिद्ध करण्याचा प्रयन्त केला गेला. पण हेही रुप फार काळ टिकले नाही.

तुम्हांला दिसते ना, ते माझे रूप २२ जुलै १९४७ रोजी निश्चित केले गेले. भारताच्या संविधान समितीने या दिवशी माझ्या या रूपाला मान्यता दिली. त्यानुसार गर्द केशरी, पांढरा व गर्द हिरवा या क्रमाने आडवे तीन पट्टे व मधल्या पांढऱ्या पट्टयावर निळया रंगातील अशोकचक्र हे माझे रूप भारताचा अधिकृत राष्ट्रध्वज म्हणून सिद्ध झाले.

डॉ. सर्वपल्ली राधाकृष्णन यांनी माझ्या रुपामागचा राष्ट्रनेत्यांचा विचार छान समजावून सांगितला आहे. माझ्या अंगावरील तीनही रंग वेगवेगळ्या गोष्टींचे सूचक आहेत. केशरी रंग देशभक्ती आणि त्याग यांचे प्रतीक आहे, तर माझा हिमधवल रंग चारित्र्य, शांतता आणि मांगल्य यांचा सूचक आहे आणि हिरवा रंग समृद्धीचा दर्शक आहे. माझ्यावरील निळे चक्र साऱ्या जगाला सूचित करते की, हे राष्ट्र धर्म, नीती आणि प्रगती यांच्याच मार्गावर अखंड गतिमान राहील.

म्हणूनच म्हणतातः

'झाडावरून प्राजक्त ओघळतो, त्याचा आवाज होत नाही याचा अर्थ असा होत नाही की, त्याला वेदना होत नाही'.

मित्रिमैत्रिणींनो एखादया थोर नेत्याच्या वा शूरवीराच्या शवपेटीवर मला ठेवले जाते, तेव्हा माझे मन भरुन येते पण तो त्या व्यक्तीचा त्याच्या कार्याचा गौरव असतो. ही आहे माझी कहाणी! सहस्त्र शब्दांतही न मावणारी, तरीही सफल, संपूर्ण अशी. म्हणूनच मी सांगतो,

तनी मनी बहरु दे नव-जोम, होऊ दे पुलिकत रोम-रोम घे तिरंगा हाती नभी लहरू दे उंच उंच... जयघोष मुखी, जय भारत, जय हिंद, गर्जु दे आसमंत.




माझ्या जीवनातील समृद्ध ठसे...



Customer Support



Drone Technology

What is a drone and how do drones work is answered here in this easy to understand article. Drone technology is constantly evolving as new innovation and big investment are bringing more advanced drones to the market every few months.

Below, we discuss UAV technology on the most popular drones on the market, which have all the latest drone technology. Most drones will have very similar systems incorporated.

Unmanned aerial vehicle technology covers everything from the aerodynamics of the drone, materials in the manufacture of the physical UAV, to the circuit boards, chipset and software, which are the brains of the drone.

One of the most popular drones on the market is the DJI Phantom 3. This drone was very popular with professional aerial cinematographers. While slightly old now, it uses plenty of advanced technology which is present in the very latest drones.

This UAV is ideal to explain drone technology because it has everything in one package. It includes the UAV, gimbal and camera and uses some of the top drone technology on the market today. There are already new and highly advanced drones such as the DJI Mavic 2, Mavic Air, Phantom 4 Pro, Inspire 2 and Walkera Voyager 5 that have come to the market.

HOW DRONES WORK

A typical unmanned aircraft is made of light composite materials to reduce weight and increase maneuverability. This composite material strength allows military drones to cruise at extremely high altitudes.

Drones are equipped with different state of the art technology such as infrared cameras, GPS and laser (consumer, commercial and military UAV). Drones are controlled by remote ground control systems (GSC) and also referred to as a ground cockpit.

An unmanned aerial vehicle system has two parts, the drone itself and the control system.

The nose of the unmanned aerial vehicle is where all the sensors and navigational systems are present. The rest of the body is full of drone technology systems since there is no need for space to accommodate humans.

The engineering materials used to build the drone are highly complex composites designed to absorb vibrations, which decrease the noise produced. These materials are very light weight.

DRONE TYPES AND SIZES

Drones come in a wide variety of sizes, with the largest being mostly used for military purposes such as the Predator drone. The next in size are unmanned aircraft, which have fixed wings and require short runways. These are generally used to cover large areas, working in areas such as geographical surveying or to combat wildlife poaching.

VTOL Drones

Next in size for drones are what is known as VTOL drones. Many of these are quadcopters but not all. VTOL drones can take off, fly, hover and land vertically. The exact meaning of VTOL is "Vertical Take-Off and Landing".

Many of the latest small drones such as the DJI Mavic Air and DJI Spark take VTOL to the next level and can be launched from the palm of your hand. Radar Positioning & Return Home Many of the latest drones have dual Global Navigational Satellite Systems (GNSS) such as GPS and GLONASS.

Drones can fly in both GNSS and non-satellite modes. For example DJI drones can fly in P-Mode (GPS & GLONASS) or ATTI mode, which doesn't uses satellite navigation. Highly accurate drone navigation is very important when flying especially in drone applications such as creating 3D maps, surveying landscape and SAR (Search & Rescue) missions.

APPLICATIONS OF DRONE 1. DEFENSE

While drones have been used by the military for over a decade (the Predator UAV is among the most well-known), smaller, portable drones are now being used by ground forces on a regular basis.

2. EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Innovations in camera technology have had significant impacts on the growing use of drones. UAVs outfitted with thermal imaging cameras have provided emergency response teams with an ideal solution for identifying victims who are difficult to spot with the naked eye.

3. HUMANITARIAN AID & DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to emergency response, drones have proved useful during times of natural disaster. In the aftermath of hurricanes and earthquakes, UAVs have been used to assess damage, locate victims, and deliver aid. And in certain circumstances, they are being used to prevent disasters altogether.

4. HEALTHCARE

Modern medicine has had a profound impact on preventing disease, increasing

life expectancy, and raising general standards of living. However, access to modern medicine has been rather difficult in many rural regions around the world. While medical supplies can be delivered by traditional means, certain circumstances call for quick access to drugs, blood, and medical technology — a need drones could fill.

5. AGRICULTURE

Intrinsically, our health is tied to the food we eat, with agriculture playing an important role in our well-being. Additionally, farmers are striving to reduce costs and expand yields. With the use of drones, agricultural workers are able to gather data, automate redundant processes, and generally maximize efficiency. Raptor Maps, a leader in agricultural analytics, relies on drones to help farmers better understand their potential harvest.

6. WEATHER FORECASTING

As climate change continues, scientists are leveraging new forms of hardware and software for data collection. Today, most data is collected through stationary structures or captured with geospatial imaging solutions. Drones, however, offer a versatile solution that can physically follow weather patterns as they develop.

7. PERSONAL TRANSPORTATION

While our definition of drones is typically limited to unmanned vehicles, certain forms of autonomous transportation should be considered drone transportation. The AAV requires minimal passenger input and incorporates fail-safe functionality or built-in systems for safe landings in case of engine failure or collision.

8. INTERNET ACCESS

Facebook experimented with a solarpowered drone called Aquila, which planned to provide internet access to rural parts of the world. Aquila was a core component of Facebook's Internet.org initiative before stopping development in mid-2018. Google initially acquired solar-powered drone company Titan Aerospace to provide UAV-powered internet (similar to Aquila), but the venture proved challenging. They have since pivoted toward a weather balloon-like design (Project Loon) that will provide internet access from the stratosphere.

9. SPORTS

Skycam, a robotic camera suspended from a cable-driven, computerized transport system, changed the way viewers experience televised sports. The camera provides upclose and personal perspectives that traditional, stationary cameras cannot capture. Today, Skycam is a necessity for any professional arena sports broadcast.

10. JOURNALISM AND NEWS COVERAGE

CNN reportedly has the most advanced drone program — called CNN Air — of any US news outlet. The network reports flying hundreds of missions in more than 20 countries. Footage collected by its drone fleet contributes to CNN's core news report, its Great Big Story initiative (dedicated to creating micro documentaries and short films), and other projects for Turner and Time Warner. With drones, the crew can collect footage that would be difficult to get otherwise due to safety issues, high costs, and physical barriers

11. SPACE

NASA announced in May 2018 that a robo-craft helicopter would be used in the Mars 2020 mission to find out whether there has ever been life on Mars. The helicopter will serve as a scout for the rover, gathering data about the planet's terrain and surveying areas the rover cannot reach. The small

device (it weighs less than four pounds) is experimental, and if it proves useful during the mission, it could open the door to other aerial devices being used in space exploration.

12. EDUCATION

Drones may soon be popping up in classrooms, as educators embrace the potential for teaching a wide range of skills and supplementing more traditional lessons. For instance, math teachers might use drones to help students understand proportional relationships, while English teachers might jump-start kids' language skills by using drone photography to inspire writing exercises.

13. SECURITY

Security companies are using drones to provide more comprehensive surveillance systems for industrial, commercial, and residential properties. One company, Nightingale Security, enables clients to establish repeatable pathways that the drones can travel daily, monitoring key security areas. The same service deploys drones with live streaming capabilities immediately after an alarm is triggered, allowing the security team and clients to obtain key footage of a potential breach. Another business is exploring the use of drones in combination with sensors that would pick up potentially suspicious activity and then signal the aerial device to fly to that particular location.

LIFI - Light-Fidelity

Most households around the world have a broadband connection and a lot of those houses experience connection or speed issues. But what if there was a way to connect to the internet and benefit from a direct connection with much faster speeds? LI-FI stands for Light Fidelity and is a

Visible Light Communications (VLC) system which runs wireless communications that travel at very high speeds. With Li-Fi, your light bulb is essentially your router. It uses common household LED light bulbs to enable data transfer, boasting speeds of up to 224 gigabits per second.

Artificial Organs:

Around the world, lists of patients in need of an organ transplant are often longer than the lists of those willing (and able) to donate, this often results in the death of numerous patients due to the lack of availability of organ donors. Now, 50 years after the first successful heart transplant, experts believe we may be nearing an era where organ transplantation will no longer be necessary. Artificial hearts in the US are currently used as a stopgap before patients receive a biological organ; patients are provided with a fully functioning artificial heart. One patient was supported for nearly four years with an artificial heart before receiving a successful human heart transplant.

In the near future we shall surely see a time where fully functional artificial organs would be ready for transplant purpose at any condition and time.


Tryst with Devanāgarī

Have you wondered about the various ways of expressing yourself. You can express yourself with gestures, movements. facial expressions. verbal and written communication. The later being the most basic. Communication in various languages is possible. Different languages can be represented using different scripts. India has several languages belonging to different language families, the major ones being the Indo-Arvan

languages spoken by 75% of Indians and the Dravidian languages spoken by 20% of Indians.

The story of Indian literature extends back over more than 5,000 years. Indian literature has been written in many languages. Each language has made its own contribution and expressed its uniqueness. The literature of a particular language has its own special form, symbols and nuances.

Some Indian languages have a long literary history--Sanskrit literature is more than 5,000 years old and Tamil 3,000. India also has some languages that do not have written forms. There are 18 officially recognized languages in India (Konkani, Manipuri and Nepali were added in 1992) and each has produced a literature of great vitality and richness. Following are the languages and their dialects written or spoken in the various zones of our country.

There are certain languages in India which are only spoken, that is they don't have a script of their own. They are mostly written using Devanāgarī script.

Devanāgarī is also employed for Bhojpuri, Gujari, Pahari, (Garhwali and Kumaoni), Konkani, Magahi, Maithili, Marwari, Bhili, Newari, Santhali, Tharu, and sometimes Sindhi, Dogri, Sherpa and by Kashmiri-speaking Hindus. It was formerly used to write Gujarati.

Devanāgarī Scripts and its characteristics:

Devnāgarī word is derived from Sanskrit words Deva(god) and Nagari(City) which

means the "City of Gods". it implies a script that is both religious as well as urbane or sophisticated.


Devnāgarī script is derived from ancient Brahmi script emerged in 11th century AD. Devnāgarī was initially developed to write Sanskrit but was later adopted to write many other languages. Devnāgarī is the mother of all most all Indian scripts. Hindu scriptures are written in Devanagari.

Devnāgarī has no case distinction, i.e. no majuscule and minuscule letters.

All the characters have a horizontal line at the upper part, known as Shirorekha or headerline. A unique property of Devanāgarī script is the formation of conjuncts (Yuktakshar) that are combines of two (bi-consonantal) or three (triconsonantal) consonants.

About 176 bi-consonantal and 24 triconsonantal conjuncts can be formed. Vowels can be written isolated or by using variety of modifiers overhead, down, foreword or backward after the consonants they belong to & those characters are called conjuncts. Some features of the script:

Quantum Computers

Introduction

The computer is most likely one of the great technological "triggers" for future change. Every generation of computer experienced a major technological development that basically changed the way computers operate, thus resulting in increasingly smaller, cheaper, more powerful and more efficient and reliable devices. And now slowly we are going to encounter a totally new age of computers-"Quantum

Computers". Till now we have seen computers working on transistors. Ever thought about a computer which functions according to the laws of quantum? Well, our scientists have already developed such computers and shortly these computers are going to suppress the classical computers. "Quantum Computers" has already promised to revolutionize the future of computing. Over 50 years of advances in mathematics, materials science and computer science have transformed quantum computing from theory to reality!! The field of quantum computing which was initiated by the work of Paul Benioff and Yuri Manin in 1980. Richard Feynman in 1982, and David Deutschin 1985 is now being implemented in big

companies.

What is Quantum Computing?

"A classical computation is like a solo voice-one line of pure tones succeeding each other. A quantum computation is like a symphony-many lines of tones interfering with one another."

- Seth Lloyd, Programming the Universe: A Quantum Computer Scientist Takes on the Cosmos


A quantum computer is a device that performs quantum computing, which is computing using quantummechanical phenomena. The Quantum computer works with a two-mode logic gate: XOR and a mode we'll call Q01 (the ability to change 0 into a superposition of 0 and 1, a logic gate which cannot exist in classical computing). In a quantum computer, a number of elemental particles such as electrons or photons can be used (in practice, success has also been achieved with ions), with either their charge or polarization acting as a representation of 0 and/or 1. Each of these particles is known as a quantum bit, or gubit, the nature and behaviour of these particles form the basis of quantum computing. The two most relevant aspects of quantum physics

are the principles of 'superposition' and 'entanglement' .

1) Superposition

A classical computer, one that we all use almost every day uses 'bits' as the fundamental unit to store data. These 'bits' can only ever take one of two values—0 or 1.

On the quantum side of things, the cool fact about qubits is that they can take a value of 0 or 1, or-wait for it-**BOTH 0 and 1 at the same time!** We call this intermediate state as **Quantum Superposition.**



Here's a little illustration to highlight the difference between a classical bit and a qubit, and another to give you a visual of what superposition is like:

2) Entanglement

Quantum entanglement is a quantum mechanical phenomenon in which

the quantum states of two or more objects have to be described with reference to each other, even though the individual objects may be spatially separated. For example, if we consider two 'entangled' coins A and B, and say coin A is tossed and reads as heads. Now. in this case, we can be 100% certain that coin B will also read as heads. There is no chance of coin B reading as tails. Either both A and B will read heads or both will read as tails. Thus, in the same fashion, two entangled qubits, when measured, will either both have a value of 0, or both will have a value of 1. Thus, we may get our output as 00 or 11 only, with a 0% chance of getting 01 or 10. This is the idea behind quantum entanglement.

Applications

"Nature isn't classical, dammit, if vou want to make a simulation of nature you'd better make it quantum mechanical "

Now that we have seen what is a Quantum computer and how it works let us see some real life applications that will bring a lot of changes in solving complex problems.

1. Addressing world hunger

With the aid of quantum computers. chemists can work to identify a new catalyst for fertilizer to help reduce greenhouse emissions and improve global food production. This solution requires the ability to model molecular interactions which are too complex for classical computers, but well-suited for quantum computers.

2. Solving optimization problems in machine learning

Quantum computing can bring speed and efficiency to complex optimization problems in machine learning. For example, large factories aiming to maximize output require optimization of each individual process, as well as all participating components. Quantum computers can help deliver optimization insights for streamlined output, reduced waste, and lowered costs.

3. Reducing energy loss

Quantum computers will help advance materials science, creating superior new alternatives and greener technologies. One potential quantum computing application is the development of hightemperature superconductors which could enable lossless transmission of eneray.

4. Simulation

In 1981, Nobel Prize—winning physicist Richard Feynman delivered his seminal "Simulating Physics lecture Computers". His idea was that unlike a classical computer which could only approximate a simulation of physics, a quantum computer could simulate it exactly – as quantum physics. In a paper published in 1982 he said, "I therefore believe it's true that with a suitable class of quantum machines you could imitate any quantum system, including the physical world." Today quantum materials simulation is being actively pursued by scientists around the world, and some see it as the first "killer application" for quantum computers.

Cryptography

Quantum computers can perform factoring exponentially more efficiently than digital computers. New cryptography methods are being developed, though it may take time: in August 2015 the NSA began introducing a list of quantum-resistant cryptography methods that would resist quantum computers, and in April 2016 the National Institute of Standards and Technology began a public evaluation process lasting four to six years. There are also promising quantum encryption methods being developed using the oneway nature of quantum entanglement. In the next decade or two, virtually all of the cryptographic software and hardware will have to be reconstructed and replaced. From managing money to massive datasets, quantum computing's applications are seemingly endless. Advanced computing power could lead to more than just innovation; it also could lead to lessened risk

Conclusion

As tech companies, computer scientists, and theoretical physicists help to perfect this technology, these truly amazing applications of quantum computing could become ubiquitous—and drive us further into a quantum age. It's hard to predict the future! Building a quantum computer is extremely difficult, but the potential to solve major problems that classic computers cannot solve encourages big companies to spend a lot of time and resources first, and progress is quickly made. This is a long and complex process, and industry experts will have to work hard to prepare for the major transition.

There's still a long way to go before they go mainstream, but quantum computers are firmly in the realm of reality and not science fiction, says IBM's Dr. Christine Ouvang.

Virtual Reality A Parallel Dimension

People all over this planet desire a pause to servicing and enjoy being treated to the various diversions available through the achievement of humankind. Virtual reality (VR) holds the key to one of the most evolutionary technologies invented for the entertainment of people. It presents a beautiful concept to excite people with a refreshing take on the perception of reality.

What Is Virtual Reality?

Technically, Virtual Reality is the generation of 3-Dimensional images by a computer which simulate the user to be present within a non-existing space. Simply, it is the creation of an environment which does not exist in a physical form. The term 'Virtual Reality' is broken down as virtual, defined as "not physically existing, but made to appear by software", and reality representing the real time. Jaron Lanier is considered as one of the most important pioneers of Virtual Reality.

How Does It Work?

The basis of VR relies on two of the five senses, that is, sight and sound. Virtual Reality Headset comes into the picture (no pun intended) for the assistance of VR. This headset is a head-mounted device that enables the user to experience VR through the visuals rendered on screen. A single headset (or two, one for each eye) intervenes the user's line of sight with a screen, eliminating any interaction of the user with the real world. Two autofocus lenses are placed between the screen and the user's eves that track the movement of the eyes and adjust their positioning in accordance. The visuals on the screen are rendered either by using a mobile phone or HDMI connected to a PC.

Immersive Virtual Reality

Immersive Virtual Reality is an element of VR that enhances the VR experience and relies on external stimuli such as sound, touch or any other factors which would contribute to the complete immersion of the user into a strange, new environment. Immersive VR consists of certain prerequisites. Some of these are a frame rate of minimum 60 fps, an equally competent refresh rate and a minimum 100-degree Field Of View (FOV), although the favoured one would a 180 degree FOV.




VR In Business

Report on DBT - Star College Scheme

The science of today is the technology of tomorrow

The DBT - STAR College Scheme grant is one of the best opportunity provided by the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India, to colleges to strengthen their undergraduate Science programs.

Being in the third year of the cycle, Coordinator, Dr. Sagarika Damle along with the five departmental coordinators (Biotechnology, Chemistry, Life Sciences, Microbiology and Statistics) of K.C.College that received grants under this scheme, did their best to raise the bar of excellence in the activities. The number of activities conducted this year outnumbered the last two years and a total of 344 activities were conducted by the five departments under this scheme. Though the departments conducted

Though the departme Though the departments conducted most of the activities, independently, there were some programs that were conducted at an interdepartmental level. where all departments came together to organize these programs.

- 1. Summer and Winter School for SHP and CPCA students: Some of the training sessions of these programs, were conducted under the umbrella of Star Activities. Talks on Antisuperstition, Visual communication, Environmental Awareness. workshops on Photoshop, Gender Sensitization. research modules such as proposal writing, research paper reading etc engaged the minds of students.
- Two of the best talks that motivated students were given by renowned Social reformist, **Dr. Prakash Amte** from Hemlkasa, who spoke on the Role of Youth in nation building. He stressed upon the hardships faced by rural India and yet the incredible

- progress made by the youth from his region, in spite of the difficulties of resources. The second talk was given by the famous Geneticist of NIRRH. Dr. Deepak Modi. who put forth interesting facts regarding sex determination in humans, during his speech, 'How and why Sex matters'.
- 3. Sci Code #18: An Innovative Intercollegiate Science Fest, involving all seven science departments of the college, was organized for the first time this year, on 25th and 26th September 2019. Entitled, 'Sci Code # 18', it had a plethora of interesting organized by science departments, namely Bioethnica, Microfiesta, Data Championship, Open Stage, Inspirous, Chemvision, Origamy and Nature Photography. A total of 17 colleges across Mumbai, with 449 participants made this program a huge success. An innovative idea from each of the event got a special prize for 'Innovative Idea' by Principal Dr. Bagla. For eg. 'Neutrophil Wrap' that can be used for Arthritis treatment was awarded as an innovative idea from Biotech department. In Life Sciences department, a Model of Microscope, made by using healthy Salad material, was given the prize of Innovative idea. A distinguished panel of iudges, Dr. **Tejas** Lokhande, Dr. Rohan Gawankar, Mrs. Yamini Tayal and many more, were experts from the field and also some of our retired teachers, who were very happy to revisit K.C. as a iudae.
- Intercollegiate Research Scholars Meet 2019: A forum for presenting research findings of undergraduate students, was organized on 25th February 2019. The esteemed panel

- of judges included Dr. Javashree Pawar, Dr. Madhura Ghaval, Dr. Manish Hate, Mr. Wilson Rao, Mr. Saju V. George. A total of 72 student participants from K. C. and other colleges, namely, Patkar, Elphinston, Jai Hind, Sophia, Royal college etc, presented their research work in Oral presentations. Trophies and certificates were awarded to the winners in each category by the invited judges. An abstract compilation book of proceedings were released during the inaugural function by the quest of the day, Dr. Swarup Shah.
- 5. In addition to the above programs, there were many more events that were organized under the DBT Star banner, in association with other academic bodies such as Internal Quality Assurance Cell, or other science departments of K.C.College. A Lecture and Exhibition on BARC **Technologies** in Collaboration with BARC was organized on 30th November 2018. Mr. R. K.Sinah Dr. Sunita **Sonawane** and from BARC, gave an idea about various technologies operated and indigenously produced at Bhabha Atomic Research Centre along with an interesting talk on Radio nuclear Therapy. The program also displayed a number of posters exhibiting these technologies. A total of 129 participants comprising of faculty and students attended this program. A session on Yoga Therapy was organized jointly with IQAC on 9th January 2019. Various aspects of Yoga and Life style changes to improve health and overall quality of life was explained lucidly by Prof. Satbir **Singh Khalsa**. Associate Professor. Harvard School of Medicine - US. More than 200 participants from

Faculty Degree and Junior college and students, enjoyed this event. To celebrate the National Science Day on 28th February 2019, a talk by **Dr. Jeremy Simpson**, Vice Principal, International University College, Dublin, Ireland, explained the finer aspects of molecular and cell biology and research opportunities for Indian students in IrelandIt was attended by 100 participants of Science stream, predominantly by students of Biology discipline.

The scheme successful was generating interest in exploring newer avenues in science experiential teaching and research activities among faculty and students which indirectly resulted in increase in the number of research Improved interdisciplinary and trans-disciplinary approach was observed in choosing the research topic by students. Efficient techniques in handling and use of instruments were learnt by students, teaching and non-teaching staff. Infrastructural upgradation of laboratory and increase in number of glassware, chemicals, raw materials etc. made it easier to pursue many new and extension activities in the laboratory. Many demonstrative experiments could be converted to hands-on experiments. Various projects,

lectures and workshops helped the students to understand practical applications of certain topics included in the theory part of their syllabus and also helped them in enhancing scientific temper,up gradation of analytical, research, functional and soft skills. Students were also trained in scientific documentation that resulted in efficient record keeping of various events, Newsletters, Nutritional Recipe Book, Abstract Book, R- Software Manual, etc. The excursions and field trips helped them to connect with environment and enjoy the learning outside the four walls of the classroom. Industrial visits, improved their understanding of a process or product generation in a professional and economically viable set up. Learning beyond boundaries of curriculum, resulted in improvement in attendance and overall examination grades for students. Through the activities conducted. students aot exposure to a wider spectra of knowledge and connectivity with experts in the field. This helped in the visibility of the strengths of various departments of K.C.College and resulted in opportunities of consultancy. For example, Statistics started free consultancy and the Rsoftware manual generated by their department, Statistics and Operations

Research'was included as a reference

manual during revision of TYBSc syllabus by University of Mumbai.

The year ended with a meeting of Advisory Committee Members, on 12th March 2019. Dr. Chandra Prakash Goyal, Joint Secretary Department of Biotechnology and Dr. Garima Gupta. Coordinator, DBT Star College Scheme, Govt. of India. Principal Dr. Hemlata Bagla welcomed the committee members and initiated the process of departmental presentations. Dr. Garima **Gupta**, provided useful tips to the faculty members during their presentations. Other advisory committee members, Dr. Sunita Shailajan (HOD, Dept of Botany, Ruia College) and Dr. Smita Mahale, Director, National Institute of Research in Reproductive Health, Mumbai, reiterated their promise of helping K.C. College, for pursuing their goal of obtaining Star status in near future.

6th INTERNATIONAL MEDIA SUMMIT – MEDIA INTEGRITY

February 15-16, 2019

The Department of Mass Media organized its Sixth Media Summit - an International Conference on Media Integrity on February 15-16, 2019. The two-day conference organized in association with The Hindu was attended by media professionals, researchers and delegates from various national and foreign universities from Sweden, Canada, Pennsylvania and Australia.

The pre-conference event was held on February 14, 2019 which included a Faculty Training-Program on Academic Social Responsibility and Advanced Trends in Media Research presented by **Dr. Sangeeta Bagga-Gupta**. Professor Chair, School of Education and Communication, Jönköping University, Sweden and Dr. Uiiwala Barve. Head. Department of Communication and Journalism, Savitribai Phule Pune University, respectively. The session was chaired by Dr. Sunder Rajdeep, Chairman Board of Studies in Mass Media, University of Mumbai, A 'Factchecking' workshop was also organized in association with the Mumbai Press Club, which was conducted by Googlecertified trainer Dr. Umesh Arya, from Guru Jambeshwar University. Hisar, Haryana. Dr. Arya, trained over 100 for journalists and budding media professionals across sections on ways to detect fake news over the digital platforms.



'GENDERED ACADEMIC CULTURES AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT IN THE ACADEMIA: #ME TOO AND BEYOND

'NATIONAL SEMINAR, NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM AND OUTREACH DAY 6th March – 8th March, 2019

Women's Development Cell, University of Mumbai and Gender Issues Cell, K C College jointly organised a National Seminar, National Symposium and Outreach Day on 'Gendered Academic Cultures and Sexual Harassment in the Academia: #Me Too and Bevond' on 6th, 7th and 8th March, 2019. The #Me Too campaign in academia and in domains beyond the academia provided the immediate context for this three day event. The publication of Raya Sarkar's list of sexual predators in academia brought to the fore the gendered aspects of academia and the widespread misogyny and sexism prevalent in academic spaces. The three day event sought to map and understand how the gender regime is constructed and reinforced on campuses. Through a National Seminar on March 6th, a National Symposium on March 7th, an Outreach day on March 8th we sought to collectively deliberate on #Me Too movement in particular and Sexual harassment at workplace in general. The programme witnessed rich deliberations spread over three days with teachers, students and non teaching staff participating in large numbers.

Day 1: National Seminar

Theme: Reflecting on #Metoo in the Academia: Learnings from the Women's Movement and Way Forward

Venue: University of Mumbai

Day One programme began with brief opening remarks by **Dr Gita Chadha**, Chairperson, UWDC, **Meher Bhoot**, Secretary UWDC and **Dr Hemlata Bagla**, Principal K C College. Dr.Bagla highlighted the role of management

and administration in creating gender friendly spaces on campus and spoke about the systemic gender biases within educational institutions and how we must inspire confidence in students to report instances of sexual harassment. Th theme for the National Seminar was "Reflecting on #Metoo in the Academia: Learnings from the Women's Movement and Way Forward". There were two Round Tables during the course of the day with discussants drawn from University of Mumbai, IITB, SNDT Women's University and Ambedkar University Delhi. The two Lead Speakers were **V Geetha**, Feminist Writer and Activist and Mary John from Centre For Women's Development Studies. New Delhi. The discussants included Rowena Robinson (IIT), Gita Chadha and Kanchana Mahadevan (University of Mumbai). Monica Sakhrani and **Veena Gowda** (Feminist lawyers), Leena Puiari and Nivedita Rao (K C College), Putul Sathe (SNDT). The Round Tables were moderated by Women's Rights Activist Chayanika Shah. Day One witnessed enriching deliberations that centred on 'due process', disciplines and their gendered aspects, the churning within University spaces so on and so forth. The programme ended with an Open Session where faculty shared their experiences of beings members of

Day 2 - National Symposium,

Theme - **#Metoo**: Conversations and Expressions Beyond the Academia

Venue: K C College

Day two programme was organised at K C College. It began with a welcome address by Principal Dr Hemlata Bagla followed by brief opening remarks by Dr Gita Chadha, Chairperson University Women's Development Cell and Dr Leena Puiari. Convenor Gender Issues Cell, K C College. The first panel discussion titled "Talking Across Cultural Domains". included an enriching account of experiences of women outside the academia. The panelists included women from the media and journalism like Divva Kandukuri and Meena Menon, as well as from the performing arts, poet and comedian, Mahima Kukreja, classical dancer Nrithya Pillai and visual artist **Bharati Kapadia**. This panel was moderated by V Geetha and Mary John. The second panel discussion of the day on "Students' Voices: Reflecting upon #MeToo", was moderated by Poushali Basak and Ashika Bhargava with Himani and **Shen** from Ambedkar University, Delhi and Pournima Yahwant Arvel and Akanksha Singh from TISS, Mumbai as panelists. The students panel saw rich deliberations on the gendered nature of academic institutions and what LoSHA meant for students.

consent in Kathak." Though a work in progress, the performance was mesmerising and explored the idea of consent in classical dance especially Kathak. What followed was an even more intense discussion on the various sexist and misogynist elements of Indian classical dance and the various ways in which women and consent are represented in them. The last session was Open Mic which was led by **Ruben Mascarenhas**, co founder of the 'Litmus Test Project'. There was poetry reading, #Me too narratives and performances on #Me Too.

Day Three: Outreach Day

Venue: University of Mumbai

The last day of the event was an Outreach Day held on 8th March, to commemorate Women's day and largely aimed at the non teaching staff of the University. There was a panel discussion on "Challenges of Sexual Harassment at Workplace' followed by a Self Defence workshop. The three day programme concluded with a celebration of women's arts and lives from the margins of our cultures. We rejoiced through dance with **Sangeet Bari**, a nationally and internationally acclaimed show on the lives and the art of Lavani dancers, with the Lavani dancers themselves.







Predator on campus

Since May 2018, nine cases of sexual harassment have been reported across colleges in Mumbai. But this is the tip of the iceberg, say insiders. Students have little faith that institutes will protect them

IT was two years ago, at a college picnic when Pooja R (name changed on request) first confided in her 33-yearold professor about dealing with anxiety and how she'd lost faith in therapy. "At the time. sir suggested that I join his the atre group after college. He said it would help me snap out of whatever I was going through," the graphic design student studying at an institution affillated with a foreign university, says. Over the next few weeks, Pooja, now 21, remembers feeling "a lot of better". "In fact, sir had become a close confidant."

Things started getting uncomfortable, when he placed his hand on her thigh, dur-ing a rehearsal. "I wasn't sure what to make of it. I thought was over-thinking and let it pass," she says. It got out of hand, when during a visit to his home, he kissed her on the lips. When she resisted, he kissed her neck. Frozen with fear, she didn't stop him, but later ignored him at college "He had become such a huge support system that it was difficult to let him go. Yet, that would mean to offer consent to everything else. I eventually gave in." It was only later, when she started seeking professional therapy that she realised she had been emotionally and sexually abused.

In February, another incident came to light at Bhavan's College, Chowparty, where a student alleged that she had been harassed by her professor who asked sexual favours in return for better grades. Neither Pooja's college nor Bhavan's had a redressal cell in place when the complaints were brought up.

If the #MeToo storm revealed how poorly equipped
corporate India is while dealing
with sexual harassment cases,
Mumbai's educational institutes are perhaps worse off, because the survivors are in their
teens and more vulnerable.

'Too powerful to challenge'

In 2017, close on the heels of the Harvey Weinstein #MeToo shocker, Raya Sarkar,

then a 24-year-old law student in California, had published a crowd-sourced list on Facebook of professors involved in sexual harassment cases. With over 75 names from more than 30 colleges and universities in India and abroad—including one from a Pune college—the list had for the first time turned the spotlight on predators within the campus.

Yet, the numbers are possibly deceivingly low.

Since early last year, nine cases of sexual harassment

have come to the fore from colleges in Mumbai alone, pointing out how deep-seated the problem is. In May 2018, a student from a reputed Matunga college, filed a police complaint against her HOD who demanded sexual favours in order to clear her assignment. A few months later, in September, students from Bandra's Rizvi College of Architecture, sported black attire to protest the unprofessional conduct of their faculty after a female student complained about her professor sending inappropriate messages. The cases are, if anything, symptomatic of what is plaguing the city's academic system. And this, despite the existence of Women's Development Cells and the Internal Complaints Committees (ICCs), introduced by the University of Mumbai in 2013, to make colleges a safe space for students.

It was the growing wave of awareness post #MeToo that got an alumni of Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS) Mumbai, from the 2004-06 batch, to speak out on Facebook against a senior faculty member, Professor P Vijayakumar, who she claimed had abused his position and sexually harassed and exploited her during the final months of her course at TISS.

Speaking to mid-day from the US, where she is currently

based, the student, who wish es to remain anonymous, said she had refused to do anything about it then, because "the professor had great power in his hands" as he was in-charge of her placement too. "At the time, I did not even have the vocabu lary to talk about sexual harassment and wasn't able to identify that what was happening to me was abuse of power. But, it is not just then. Even now, I've students disclose to me that they had similar experiences. But they are afraid to come forward. I am not in India. The erson has no power over me nymore, which was why I was able to come forward," she says.

Graphic design student Pooja had only sought help when her professor cut off from her after he was unceremoniously sacked for an entirely different reason. "It's then that I hit a slump. I reached out to a therapist. She later got me to file a police complaint against the professor," she adds. It was after the incident, that her college created a system to address harassment issues.

Another 18-year-old, who was pursuing her junior college from a well-known institute in Bandra, remembers how she was harassed last year by a student from within the institute, with vulgar text messages and calls. "I filed a police complaint, but didn't address it with the

college because I had lost faith in my teachers. The previous year, when my best friend's boyfriend [he wasn't from the college] managed to walk into our campus and threat-ened to throw acid on me, over a fight, I had called the cops for help as the college guards had not reacted. I was later given a dressing down for bringing a bad name to the college, and teachers had turned hostile. How could I trust the same people to take my side?"

That colleges in the city are not doing enough to create awareness about sexual harassment and what recourse students can seek, is also an area of concern. The complainant from Bhavan's College, for instance, says she wasn't afraid to come forward, but did not know whom to approach. "While the University has mandated the establishment of ICC [see box for function] in every college, I was not aware of any such cell in ours. More so, I suspected that no concrete

KC College's Gender Issues Cell

In order to make existing platforms more "inclusive of multiple genders", the Women's Development Cell at KC College in Churchgate repositioned itself as the Gender Issues Cell (GIC). This cell, like the WDC. has representatives from the teaching and nonteaching staff and student representatives, besides an NGO member While the ICC exists as a statutory mechanism to inquire into complaints of sexual harassment. sometimes the GIC receives verbal complaints from students about certain

inappropriate comments made by teachers, nonteaching staff and peers," says Leena Pujari, convener of GIC. These complaints are promptly addressed thanks to a supportive administration, say students. But, the greater concern is the heteronormative bias within educational campuses The bigger challenge for GIC now is to sensitise students and staff to issues of gueer rights on campus and the use of gender neutral vocabulary and non cis-gender narratives in the classroom. We have to traverse a long journey on this," adds Pulari,

trolling she faced as a result of it.

3)Documentary screening on plastic ocean

Kanupriya Pawar, Safai Bank Co-

ordinator, WWF- India, Maharashtra State Office had given a talk and shown a screening of plastic ocean on January 8, 2019, to F.Y.B.Sc. students of K.C College who were around 50 in number. The content of the talk was as follows:

Mother Earth has given us everything in abundance yet uncontrolled human actions progressively contribute to the deterioration of her condition. This has given rise to some of the most troubling environmental concerns such as deforestation, increased carbon footprint, air pollution, and industrial waste and plastic pollution. Despite popular belief one can arguably say that the hazardous effects of plastic can be greatly reduced to the environment if it is utilized responsibly by effective reuse and recycling. One such type of plastic is Multi-Layered Plastic comprising a thin foil of aluminium, sandwiched between multiple layers of plastic and paper. Most companies use this plastic because it reduces volume, does not take up a lot of space and it is graphics friendly. This is one kind of plastic which cannot be recycled easily and even rag-pickers refuse to pick. They are only suitable for single use and then litter Mother Earth for the subsequent 450 years or more. Dumping MLP waste into your dustbins is not the solution.

They need to undergo an elaborate process in order to be recycled without littering the Earth. To take a step further to address this concern, WWF Maharashtra State Office has associated with Mumbai Sustainability Centre on the 'Safai Bank of India' initiative. This platform aims to collect the MLP waste from the respective institutions/ society. We are inviting your institute to be a part of Safai Bank of India through WWF-India's Volunteer Programme. We request your cooperation in taking the necessary steps to help the environment by registering your institute for this

programme through a simple registration process followed by providing a small storage for the collected MLP's which will be duly collected by the Safai Bank team on a monthly basis from your location.

The population present at the location was self-explanatory how to import the cause is and people are ready to accept the change for using alternatives for plastic instead of plastic. We as students were happy and excited to visit the exhibition. There were over 60 stalls of biodegradable alternatives for plastic products and around 50 self-help groups participated.

All the stalls had their group names written on top and mostly chart on the background explaining the process they focus on and their aim. We were happy to see so many alternatives available. The repolymerization process and Symbiotic Recycling are the topics of which we learnt the functioning and benefits. Steel and wooden straws were good alternatives for plastic ones. Compostable bags.

Few of the self-help groups were Anand Ganesh Mahila Bachat gat (9702412452), Mahila Bachat Gat, Saraswati Mahila Bachat gat, Govardhan Eco village and Samarth Mahila Bachat Gat. Cloth bags of different sizes were available with the difference in price and quality stall to stall as cheap as rupee 1 to rupee 50 were available to buy. Reusable cloth bags were decorated attractively to draw attention. Wooden spoons, plates, containers etc. were available from rupees 5 to 9 per piece which could only be used once. Packing containers were in a variety ranging in sizes. Plastic flowers for display and decoration purpose are mostly used so as an alternative to that paper flowers were available for display with paper lanterns and vases. The flowers were attractive and it was one of the most visited stalls. Threads of used plastic were designed to make rags, basket, bags, purses, etc. and must say they were well made as you see in the picture below.

Water conservation activity was conducted by conducting two check dams (Vanarai bandhara) in Swanandyog, Village Sonavale, Badlapur in August 2018, nearly 100 volunteers were part of this challenging work. In month of January - February 2019 volunteers constructed permanent Dam (Bandhara) on water stream in the village Karwale, which is 25 feet long and 6 feet broad.

Vanmohotsav is one of the Plantation drive initiated by Government of Maharashtra, K.C. volunteers continued their fruit tree plantation drive at Karwale along with tree plantation at Maharashtra School Dadar, CGS colony Antop Hill and Churchgate area, in all 350 saplings were planted. Education project was conducted at Colaba Municipal School in collaboration with NGO Dharma Bharati Mission wherein 30 volunteers took part actively, Miss. Janhavi Shah, Mr Hariom

Tiwari and Miss. Namita Dhariwal . Digital education was successfully conducted in 5 different areas of Adopted village Karwale to made children aware of digital Technology. One of our ex volunteer along with his family members distributed stationaries to 300 plus children from adopted village worth rupees 50,000/- from nursery to graduation level. The biggest achievement of the education project is the Development of science Laboratory for Sane Guruji Vidyalaya, Ghatim-Navghar, District Palghar. Teams of 50 volunteers sincerely work to provide Science Laboratory to the school students who were very much away from practical pieces of equipment, glassware, models, Microscopes etc. The total funding of Rs. 3,00,000 was made by generous Mrs Suman Tulsiani. The inauguration of the laboratory was done on 28th December by Dr Atul Salunke, State Liaison officer and OSD Government of Maharashtra along with Principal Hemlata Bagla and Vice Principals.

Women Empowerment project of KC NSS unit has really made a change in the thought process of ladies from the adopted village in 3600. Active participation of women in self-dependant projects is growing day by day. We have provided them training followed by purchasing of raw material, making of finished product and marketing has been taught to the group of ladies. This is also an opportunity for volunteers too to learn entrepreneurship. The seasonal work was given to them. (Rakhi making- August. Diya and Pot painting-October-November) Cotton bag making etc. Our Swayam siddha project of making Turmeric, Chilli and coriander seed's powder is functioning slowly but steadily. All the products are being sold in KC premises.


Celebration of International Women's

Ribbon club activities were successfully conducted by a team of volunteers to create awareness of HIV -AIDS awareness. Miss. Surabhi Gupta, Miss. Neha Mer and Mr Prashant Chaudhari who was trained at MDACS conducted activities at KC by organising informative session by Mrs Kavita Bhatia, Mrs Aradhana Gaware, conducting poster essay and plate painting competitions. They also arrange Stem cell registry in association with Marrow registry of India. 191 students gave their blood sample so that in future they may save the life of leukaemia patients if required. Thalassaemia screening was organised in association with Think foundation, 203 volunteers took advantage of the same. This year three blood donation drives were arranged at KC main building and Colaba campus in association with Tata Memorial Hospital and Jaslok Hospital, 435 units of Blood units were collected. Our 25 volunteers are regular Platelet donors for Tata Memorial Hospital. Authorities of Tata Hospital for their valuable contribution of donating 43 and 70 units of platelets respectively felicitated Mr Pritam Maii and Mr Rohan Nikam.

Adopt grand Maa is one more project in which volunteers spare time with senior citizens from old age homes. This year too 30 volunteers visited Snehbandhan , village Kansal, District Raigad on 30th October spent one day with the senior citizens and invited them for Anandotsav. similarly, they visit regularly to All Saints home, Mazgaon and spend quality time with aunties over there.
